The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to independent contractors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 148B of chapter 149 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official
Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following subsection:-

3 (f) An individual who is: (1) independently established as a freelance writer, editor, proofreader or indexer in the publishing industry and works out of his or her own residence; or 4 (2) an artist, whose work constitutes intellectual property to which copyright laws apply and who 5 works out of his or her own residence or studio, shall not be subject to the requirements of 6 paragraph (2) of subsection (a). This exception shall only be available to an individual freelancer 7 or artist and not to any individual working with or for that person. This exception shall not apply 8 to any circumstance in which an individual freelancer or artist has been coerced, threatened or 9 intimidated into establishing a work arrangement for another person for the purposes of 10

11 exempting that person from the requirements of this chapter or chapter 151.
