By Mrs. Nyman of Hanover and Senator Kennedy, a joint petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3499) of Rhonda L. Nyman and Thomas P. Kennedy (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the town of Hanover to grant an additional license for the sale of wines and malt beverages to be drunk on the premises. An act authorizing the Town of Hanover to grant a certain license for the sale of alcoholic beverages.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the licensing
2 authority of the Town of Hanover may grant one (1) additional license for the sale of wines and
3 malt beverages to be drunk on the premises (a/k/a beer & wine/restaurant), pursuant to section 12
4 of chapter 138, for an establishment located at 1143 Broadway, Hanover Massachusetts. The
5 license shall be subject to all of said chapter 138 except said section 17.

6 SECTION 2. Further notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the
7 licenses so issued herein shall not be counted towards the quota of licenses allowed to the Town
8 of Hanover pursuant to that section 17, and shall not impact an increase in that quota to which
9 the Town would be entitled owing to a future increase in population.

10 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
