An Act exempting the position of fire chief of the town of Natick from the provisions of the civil service law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 8 of the Acts and Resolves of 1925 is hereby repealed.
  
- 2 SECTION 2. The position of fire chief in the town of Natick shall be exempt from the provisions
- 3 of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.
  
- 4 SECTION 3. The provisions of Section 1 and Section 2 of this act shall not impair the civil
- 5 service status of the person holding the position of fire chief in the town of Natick on the
- 6 effective date of this act.
  
- 7 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
