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## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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In the Year Two Thousand Eleven  
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An Act relative to affordable housing in the town of Salisbury.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 SECTION 1. (a) Notwithstanding section 20 through 23, inclusive, of Chapter 40B of the  
2 General Laws and any regulations promulgated thereunder, any manufactured home as defined  
3 in section 32Q of chapter 140 of the General Laws, or any other dwelling unit built on a chassis  
4 and containing complete electrical, plumbing and sanitary facilities, and designed to be installed  
5 on a temporary or permanent foundation for permanent living quarters, having been situated  
6 continuously on the same parcel in the Town of Salisbury for twenty years or more as of January  
7 1, 2012, and having been assessed as a mobile or manufactured home by the Salisbury Board of  
8 Assessors, shall be considered “low or moderate income housing,” as defined in section 20 of  
9 chapter 40B of the General Laws.
- 10 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
