The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

establishing a sick leave bank for Arcelia Williams-Sullivan, an employee of the Massachusetts Rehabilitation Commission.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Notwithstanding any general or special law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the Massachusetts
- 2 rehabilitation commission shall establish a sick leave bank for Arcelia Williams-Sullivan, an
- 3 employee of the commission. Any employee of the commission may voluntarily contribute 1 or
- 4 more sick, personal or vacation days to the sick leave bank for use by Arcelia Williams-Sullivan.
- 5 Sick leave bank days shall not be used for absences unrelated to the illness or disability that
- 6 necessitated the establishment of the sick leave bank as determined by the commission.
- 7 Whenever Arcelia Williams-Sullivan terminates employment with the commission or requests to
- 8 dissolve the sick leave bank, any remaining time in the sick leave bank shall be transferred to the
- 9 extended illness leave bank.
