## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act establishing a sick bank for Jay Brinkerhoff.

*Whereas*, the deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is forthwith to establish forthwith a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the Supreme Judicial Court, therefore, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Notwithstanding any general or special law, or rule, or regulation to the contrary, the Supreme
- 2 Judicial Court shall establish a sick leave bank for Jay Brinkerhoff, an employee of the office.
- 3 Any employee of the Supreme Judicial Court, Trial Court or Appeals Court may voluntarily
- 4 contribute 1 or more sick, personal or vacation days to the sick leave bank for use by Jay
- 5 Brinkerhoff. Whenever Jay Brinkerhoff terminates employment with the office or requests to
- 6 dissolve the sick leave bank, any remaining time in the sick leave bank shall be transferred to the

7 extended illness leave bank. Sick leave bank days shall not be used for absences unrelated to the  
8 illness or disability that necessitated the establishment of the sick leave bank as determined by  
9 the Supreme Judicial Court.
