By Mr. Jones of North Reading, a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of Bradley H. Jones, Jr., and others relative to the crime of failing to notify law enforcement officials of a missing or deceased child. The Judiciary.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to the protection of children.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 265 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, is
- 2 hereby amended by adding to the end thereof the following section:--
- 3 “Section 13N. Failure to Notify Law Enforcement of Missing or Deceased Child
- 4 For the purposes of this section, the following words shall have the following meanings:--
- 5 “Person having care and custody”, a parent, guardian, employee of a home or institution or any
- 6 other person with equivalent supervision or care of a child, whether the supervision is temporary
- 7 or permanent.
- 8 “Child”, any person under 14 years of age.
- 9 "Law enforcement authority", any police department in the commonwealth or any of its
- 10 political subdivisions.

11 "Missing child or children", any person under the age of 14 years missing from his normal and
12 ordinary place of residence or last known whereabouts and whose whereabouts cannot be
13 determined by the person responsible for such child's care.

14 Whoever, having care and custody of a child, fails to notify a law enforcement authority of the
15 death of a child, accidental or otherwise, within 2 hours of said known death being discovered
16 with the intent to mislead a public official, impede any investigation, or causes an investigation
17 to be impeded, shall be punishable by a term of imprisonment in the state prison for not more
18 than 10 years or imprisonment in the house of correction for not more than 2 ½ years.

19 Whoever, having care and custody of a child, finds the child missing and fails to notify a law
20 enforcement authority of said missing child in a within five days with the intent to mislead a
21 public official, impede an investigation, or causes an investigation to be impeded, shall be
22 punishable by a term of imprisonment in the state prison for not more than 10 years or
23 imprisonment in the house of correction for not more than 2 ½ years.

24 SECTION 2. Section 13J of chapter 265 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official
25 Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, on line 29, the words "two and one-half years" and
26 inserting in place thereof the following words:- "10 years"

27 ;and further, by striking out, on line 34, the words "five years" and inserting in place thereof the
28 following:- "15 years"

29 ;and further, by striking out, on lines 35 and 36, the words "two and one-half years" and inserting
30 in the place thereof the following:- "10 years"."
