In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act apportioning electoral votes by congressional district.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 54 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by inserting after section 148 the following section:-
- 3 Section 148A. (a) Elector assigned to a congressional district.
- 4 An elector who is assigned to a congressional district shall cast a separate ballot for the
- 5 presidential and vice presidential candidate who received the largest number of votes in the
- 6 elector's respective district.
- 7 (b) At-large elector.

- 8 An elector who is unassigned to a congressional district shall cast a separate ballot for the
- 9 presidential and vice presidential candidate who received the largest number of statewide popular
- 10 votes.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
