The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act improving the earned income credit for working families.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Subsection (h) of section 6 of chapter 62 of the General Laws, as amended
- 2 by section 32 of chapter 47 of the acts of 2017, is hereby amended by striking out, in each
- 3 instance where it appears, the number "23" and inserting in place thereof the following number:-
- 4 33.
- 5 SECTION 2. Said subsection (h) of said section 6 of said chapter 62, as so amended, is
- 6 hereby further amended by striking out, in each instance where it appears, the number "33" and
- 7 inserting in place thereof the following number: 43.
- 8 SECTION 3. Said subsection (h) of said section 6 of said chapter 62, as so amended, is
- 9 hereby further amended by striking out, in each instance where it appears, the number "43" and
- inserting in place thereof the following number: 50.
- SECTION 4. Said subsection (h) of said section 6 of said chapter 62, as so amended, is
- hereby further amended by adding the following paragraph:

(3) In order to ensure the widest possible dissemination of the state and federal earned
income credit, the department shall: (i) provide all employers with a multilingual poster and a
notice that sets forth the rights to the earned income credit under this chapter; (ii) require that all
employers doing business in the commonwealth post information about the earned income credit
in a conspicuous location at the place of employment; (iii) coordinate a notification system by
the commonwealth about the earned income credit to applicants for and recipients of
unemployment insurance under chapter 151A, applicants for and recipients of transitional
assistance benefits, including food stamps, under chapter 18, and to recipients of subsidized
health insurance under chapter 118E; and (iv) collaborate with labor organizations, chambers of
commerce, municipalities, community-based organizations, and taxpayer advocates to
disseminate information about the earned income credit. The multilingual poster and notice
requirement in subparagraph (i) shall comply with the requirements for employer's
unemployment notices under clauses (i) and (iii) of subsection (d) of section 62A of chapter
151A.

SECTION 5. Section 1 of this act shall be effective January 1, 2018.

- SECTION 6. Section 2 of this act shall be effective January 1, 2019.
- SECTION 7. Section 3 of this act shall be effective January 1, 2020.
