In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act validating the results of the annual town election held in the town of Chester on May 4, 2019.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law or by-law to the contrary, all

2 acts and proceedings taken by the town of Chester at the annual town election held on May 4,

3 2019 and all actions taken pursuant thereto are hereby ratified, validated and confirmed to the

4 same extent as if the notice for the town election had been given by a warrant in full compliance

5 with law.

6 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

7 provided that the General Court may make clerical or editorial changes of form only to

8 the bill, unless the Selectmen approve amendments to the bill before enactment by the General

- 9 Court, the Selectmen having been authorized by the said Town Meeting vote to approve
- 10 amendments which shall be within the scope of the general public objectives of this petition.
