## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act requiring that broker fees in the city of Somerville be paid by the party who solicits a licensed broker.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, in the city of
- 2 Somerville, any person who performs real estate brokerage activities and is licensed or registered
- 3 pursuant to sections 87PP to 87DDD1/2, inclusive, of chapter 112 of the General Laws may
- 4 solely contract with a prospective tenant to find for rent residential property for a tenant and
- 5 present an offer to lease to the landlord or landlord's agent and negotiate on behalf of the tenant
- 6 or may solely contract with a landlord or landlord's agent to find a tenant for a property. Any fee
- 7 shall only be paid by the party, lessor or tenant who originally engaged and entered into a
- 8 contract with the licensed broker or salesperson.

9 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
