An Act providing for immediate capital improvement needs of the Commonwealth.

*Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to provide forthwith for the immediate capital improvement needs of the commonwealth, therefore, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. To provide for a program to protect, repair and improve the capital  
2 facilities of the commonwealth and for a program of capital asset acquisitions, dispositions and  
3 other improvements for general government operations, the sums set forth in sections 2, 2A, 2B  
4 and 2C, inclusive, for the several purposes and subject to the conditions specified in this act are  
5 hereby made available, subject to the laws regulating the disbursement of public funds, which  
6 sums shall be in addition to any other amounts previously appropriated for these purposes.

8           EXECUTIVE OFFICE FOR ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE

9           Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance

10           1102-2017 For costs associated with planning and studies, dispositions, acquisition of  
11 land and buildings and interests therein by purchase, prepayment of lease for a term that exceeds  
12 the useful life of the facility, gift or other transfer or by eminent domain pursuant to chapter 79  
13 of the General Laws, for the preparation of plans and specifications, disparity studies, repairs,  
14 construction, renovations, improvements, asset management, accessibility improvements,  
15 demolition, disposition, and remediation of state-owned and former county facilities and grounds  
16 and for costs associated with repair and maintenance of buildings and building systems and  
17 equipment at various facilities of the commonwealth; provided, that any federal reimbursement  
18 received by a state agency in connection with projects funded from this item may be retained by

20 without further appropriation, in addition to the amounts appropriated in this item; provided  
21 further, that all maintenance and repair work funded in this item shall be listed in the capital asset  
22 management information system administered by the division of capital asset management and  
23 maintenance; provided further, that where appropriate, the commissioner of capital asset  
24 management and maintenance may transfer funds authorized herein in accordance with a  
25 delegation of project control and supervision process pursuant to section 5 of chapter 7C of the  
26 General Laws; provided further, that funds so transferred shall be distributed based on the  
27 severity of the need that the repair shall address and other criteria developed by the division, in  
28 consultation with the secretary of administration and finance; provided further, that \$60,000,000  
29 shall be expended for the critical repairs, renovation and replacement, and deferred maintenance  
30 at state office buildings, trial courts, and executive office of public safety and security non-  
31 corrections facilities; provided further, that \$60,000,000 shall be expended for ongoing costs of  
32 the division of capital asset management and maintenance to carry out its capital programs;

33 provided further, that \$2,300,000 shall be expended for the analysis of physical security  
34 measures, as well as procedures to ensure worker safety in division of capital asset management  
35 and maintenance-operated office buildings, including necessary capital improvements, updating  
36 existing procedures and enhanced training; provided further, that \$23,200,000 shall be expended  
37 for the study for redevelopment of underutilized and unused sites, including 226 Main street in  
38 the city of Brockton, design and construction, and reuse and redevelopment; provided further,  
39 that \$1,000,000 shall be expended for the design and construction for replacement of the power  
40 distribution units and air conditioning units in the Massachusetts Information Technology Center  
41 in the city of Chelsea; provided further, that \$13,465,000 shall be expended for the study, design  
42 and construction of a phased renovation of the John W. McCormack Building in the city of  
43 Boston, which will include the existing building's infrastructure, envelope, interior common  
44 spaces, and surrounding site and will implement a phased renovation program; provided further,  
45 that \$6,150,000 shall be expended for the study, design and construction to replace existing  
46 emergency generator and transfer switches to improve reliability and safety, and to replace  
47 existing switchgears at the State House in a phased project to minimize shutdowns and  
48 disruption; and provided further, that \$4,500,000 shall be expended for the planning and study of  
49 consolidation of office space, in order to make more effective use of available resources,  
50 strategic co-location of offices, customer service and adapt to changing information-technology  
51 configurations.....\$680,000,000

52 4000-2024 For costs associated with planning and studies, dispositions, acquisition of  
53 land and buildings and interests therein by purchase, prepayment of lease for a term that exceeds  
54 the useful life of the facility, gift or other transfer or by eminent domain pursuant to chapter 79  
55 of the General Laws, for the preparation of plans and specifications, repairs, construction,

56 renovations, improvements, modernization, construction, reconstruction, furnishing, equipping,  
57 acquiring, remodeling, refurbishing, asset management, accessibility improvements, demolition,  
58 disposition and remediation of facilities and grounds operated by the various departments within  
59 the executive office for health and human services, all as the commissioner of capital asset  
60 management and maintenance, in consultation with the secretary of health and human services

66 services in connection with projects funded from this item may be retained by the executive  
67 office for administration and finance and expended for the purposes of the project, without  
68 further appropriation, in addition to the amounts appropriated in this item; provided further, that  
69 \$100,000,000 shall be expended for the repair, maintenance projects, and emergency projects at  
70 executive office of health and human service facilities; provided further, that \$199,000,000 shall  
71 be expended for the design and construction of a new facility named the "Soldier's Home in  
72 Chelsea", a 154-bed community living center for long-term care for veterans in the city of  
73 Chelsea to replace Quigley Memorial Hospital; provided further, that \$80,600,000 shall be  
74 expended to renovate the Tower Building, also known as the William A. Hinton State Laboratory  
75 Institute, in the city of Boston; provided further, that \$13,000,000 shall be expended on air  
76 conditioning, mechanical ventilation, roof replacement, and other necessary upgrades at the  
77 Western Massachusetts Hospital in the city of Westfield; and provided further, that \$20,000,000

154 expended for division employees may include the salary and salary-related expenses of these  
155 employees to the extent that they work on or in support of these projects; provided further, that  
156 \$150,000,000 shall be expended for costs of the reconstruction or replacement of court facilities  
157 located in the city of Quincy; provided further, that \$4,500,000 shall be expended to determine  
158 scope, square footage, and cost of replacement for a new Suffolk County High Rise; provided  
159 further, that \$500,000 shall be expended for a feasibility study to determine scope on a Southern  
160 Middlesex facility; provided further, that \$30,000,000 shall be expended for costs of  
161 modernization of the court facility located in the town of Malden to address envelope, life safety,  
162 holding and security, MEP systems, and cross circulation; provided further, that \$45,000,000  
163 shall be expended for the modernization of Brockton Superior Court to address envelope, life

266 security equipment, safety equipment, communications equipment, and vehicles; and provided,  
267 that \$4,000,000 shall be expended for the equipment needs the for department of correction and  
268 public safety agencies other than state police.....\$20,000,000

269 SECTION 3. To meet the expenditures necessary in carrying out sections 2 and 2A, the  
270 state treasurer shall, upon request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth in  
271 an amount to be specified by the governor, from time to time, but not exceeding, in the  
272 aggregate, \$3,205,000,000. All such bonds issued by the commonwealth shall be designated on  
273 their face, Capital Improvement Act of 2017, and shall be issued for a maximum term of years,  
274 not exceeding 30 years, as the governor may recommend to the general court pursuant to section  
275 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution. The bonds shall be payable not later  
276 than June 30, 2052. All interest and payments on account of principal on these obligations shall  
277 be payable from the General Fund. Bonds and interest thereon issued pursuant to this section  
278 shall, notwithstanding any other provision of this act, be general obligations of the  
279 commonwealth.

280 SECTION 4. To meet the expenditures necessary in carrying out section 2B, the state  
281 treasurer shall, upon request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth in an  
282 amount to be specified by the governor from, time to time, but not exceeding, in the aggregate,  
283 \$320,000,000. All such bonds issued by the commonwealth shall be designated on their face,  
284 Capital Improvement Act of 2017, and shall be issued for a maximum term of years, not  
285 exceeding 20 years, as the governor may recommend to the general court pursuant to section 3 of  
286 Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution. The bonds shall be payable not later than  
287 June 30, 2042. All interest and payments on account of principal on these obligations shall be  
288 payable from the General Fund. Bonds and interest thereon issued pursuant to this section shall,  
289 notwithstanding any other provision of this act, be general obligations of the commonwealth.

290 SECTION 5. To meet the expenditures necessary in carrying out section 2C, the state  
291 treasurer shall, upon request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth in an  
292 amount to be specified by the governor from, time to time, but not exceeding, in the aggregate,  
293 \$20,000,000. All such bonds issued by the commonwealth shall be designated on their face,  
294 Capital Improvement Act of 2017, and shall be issued for a maximum term of years, not  
295 exceeding 10 years, as the governor may recommend to the general court pursuant to section 3 of  
296 Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution. The bonds shall be payable not later than  
297 June 30, 2032. All interest and payments on account of principal on these obligations shall be  
298 payable from the General Fund. Bonds and interest thereon issued pursuant to this section shall,  
299 notwithstanding any other provision of this act, be general obligations of the commonwealth.

300 SECTION 6. Section 5 of chapter 7C of the General Laws as appearing in the 2016  
301 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 9, the figure “\$2,000,000” and  
302 inserting in place thereof the following figure:- “\$5,000,000”.

303 SECTION 7. Said section 5 of said chapter 7C, as so appearing, is hereby further  
304 amended by adding the following sentence:- “Notwithstanding the foregoing, the commissioner  
305 may delegate project control and supervision to the University of Massachusetts over projects  
306 involving structural or mechanical work with an estimated cost of less than \$10,000,000 if the  
307 commissioner determines that the University of Massachusetts has the ability to control and  
308 supervise such project. As used in this section, ‘estimated cost’ means the estimated construction  
309 cost stated in a study or program prepared in accordance with section 59.”.

310 SECTION 8. Subsection (e) of section 46 of said chapter 7C, as so appearing, is hereby  
311 amended by striking out clauses (i) and (ii) and inserting in place thereof the following clauses:-  
312 “(i) the design fee under the contract is less than \$30,000; or (ii) the estimated construction cost  
313 of the project for which the design services are required is less than \$300,000”.

314 SECTION 9. Item 7066-8000 of section 2 of chapter 258 of the acts of 2008, as amended  
315 by section 7 of chapter 237 of the acts of 2014, is hereby further amended by striking out the  
316 figure “\$1,303,055,630” and inserting in place thereof the following figure:-“\$1,403,055,630”.

317 SECTION 10. Item 7100-1000 of section 2 of said chapter 258, as amended by sections  
318 8 and 9 of chapter 237 of the acts of 2014, is hereby further amended by striking out the figure  
319 “\$1,101,500,000” and inserting in place thereof the following figure:- “\$1,201,500,000”.

320 SECTION 11. Section 3 of said chapter 258, as amended by section 10 of chapter 237 of  
321 the acts of 2014, is hereby further amended by striking out the figure “\$2,404,555,630” and

328 SECTION 14. Item 1102-5600 of said section 2C of said chapter 304 is hereby amended  
329 by striking out the following words: “that not less than \$72,000,000 shall be expended for the  
330 costs of the renovation of the probate and family court building located in the city of Salem”.

354 SECTION 20. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the bonds that  
355 the state treasurer may issue pursuant to sections 2 and 2A of this act shall be issued for terms  
356 not to exceed 30 years. All such bonds shall be payable not later than June 30, 2052, as  
357 recommended by the governor in a message to the general court dated May 31, 2017, under  
358 section 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution.

359 SECTION 21. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the bonds that  
360 the state treasurer may issue pursuant to section 2B of this act shall be issued for terms not to  
361 exceed 20 years. All such bonds shall be payable not later than June 30, 2042, as recommended  
362 by the governor in a message to the general court dated May 31, 2017, under section 3 of Article  
363 LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution.

364 SECTION 22. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the bonds that  
365 the state treasurer may issue pursuant to section 2C of this act shall be issued for terms not to  
366 exceed 10 years. All such bonds shall be payable not later than June 30, 2032, as recommended  
367 by the governor in a message to the general court dated May 31, 2017, under section 3 of Article  
368 LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution.

369           SECTION 23. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, funds  
370 borrowed by the commonwealth may be expended to reimburse municipal debt incurred to create  
371 the capital asset in the town of Norwood to be wholly owned by the commonwealth, as  
372 authorized by section 58 of chapter 239 of the acts of 2012, as amended.
