In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to persons seeking drug addiction treatment.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 34A of chapter 94C of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official

2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after paragraph (b) the following paragraph:-

(b¹/₂) A person who, in good faith, enters a police station and seeks assistance or
treatment for a person present at such police station suffering from a drug-related addiction, or a
person who, in good faith, enters a police station and seeks assistance or treatment for a drugrelated addiction, or is the subject of a good faith request for such assistance or treatment, shall
not be charged or prosecuted for possession of a controlled substance under sections 34 or 35, or
possession of drug paraphernalia under section 32I, if the evidence for such charge of possession
was gained as a result of the seeking of assistance or treatment.
