By Representatives Finn of West Springfield and Boldyga of Southwick, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4023) of Michael J. Finn and Nicholas A. Boldyga (by vote of the town) that the city known as the town of Agawam be authorized to change the timing of preliminary elections in said town to eight weeks preceding regular elections. Election Laws. [Local Approval Received.]

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act changing the timing of preliminary elections in the city known as the town of Agawam to eight weeks preceding regular elections.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 7-1 of Article 7 of the charter of the city known as the Town of

- 2 Agawam, which is on file in the office of the archivist of the commonwealth, as provided in
- 3 section 12 of chapter 43B of the General Laws, is hereby amended by striking out the existing
- 4 language and inserting in place thereof the following subsection:
- 5 Section 7-1 Town Elections: General and Preliminary
- 6 The regular town election shall be held on the first Tuesday following the first Monday in
- 7 November in each odd numbered year.
- 8 On the eighth Tuesday, preceding every regular town election, there shall be held a
- 9 preliminary election for the purpose of nominating candidates.

10	SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, this act shall be
11	submitted for acceptance to the qualified voters of the city known as the town of Agawam at the
12	2023 regular election in the form of the following question:
13	"Shall an Act passed by the General Court in the year 2023 entitled 'An Act changing the
14	timing of preliminary elections in the city known as the Town of Agawam to eight weeks
15	preceding regular elections' be accepted?"
16	Below the question shall appear a fair and concise summary of the proposed charter
17	amendment prepared by the city solicitor.
18	If a majority of the votes cast in answer to this question are in the affirmative, Section 1
19	shall take effect forthwith for all purposes relating to municipal elections held in the city known
20	as the Town of Agawam in the year 2025.
21	SECTION 3. The city solicitor shall prepare the summary required under Section 2 not
22	later than 60 days before the election in accordance with section 58A of chapter 54 of the
23	General Laws.
