By Ms. Decker of Cambridge, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4143) of Marjorie C. Decker and Sal N. DiDomenico (with the approval of the mayor and city council) that the city of Cambridge be authorized to appoint retired police officers as special police officers within said city for paid detail assignments. In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act regarding the appointment of retired Cambridge Police Department officers as special police officers within the city of Cambridge for paid detail assignments.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

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SECTION 1. The city manager of the city of Cambridge may appoint, as the city 2 manager considers necessary, retired Cambridge police officers as special police officers 3 to perform police details or any duties arising from police details or during the course of 4 police detail work, whether or not related to the detail work. The city manager shall 5 have discretion to appoint only retired Cambridge police officers as special police 6 officers and shall establish department rules, procedures and policies concerning these 7 appointments. The city manager shall appoint retired Cambridge police officers who 8 served as regular Cambridge police officers and are retired based on superannuation.

No retired police officer shall be appointed under this act as a special police officer if that officer has been retired for more than 5 years. Special police officers shall not be subject to the same maximum age restrictions as applied to regular Cambridge police officers under chapter 32 of the General Laws. Prior to appointment under this act, a retired Cambridge police officer shall pass a medical examination by a physician or other certified professional chosen or agreed to by the department to determine whether the retired Cambridge police officer is capable of performing the essential duties of a special police officer under this act. The cost of the medical examination shall be borne by the retired Cambridge police officer.

SECTION 2. Special police officers appointed under this act shall not be subject to chapter 31, section 99A of chapter 41, or chapter 150E of the General Laws.

SECTION 3. When performing the duties set forth in section 1, special police officers shall have the same power to make arrests and to perform other police functions as do regular police officers of the city of Cambridge.

SECTION 4. A special police officer shall be appointed for a 1-year term, subject to renewal at the discretion of the city manager; provided, however, that a special police officer shall be subject to suspension or removal by the city manager at his or her discretion at any time. All benefits afforded to special police officers appointed under this act shall terminate upon the conclusion of the employment term. A special police officer's appointment shall automatically terminate upon the officer's 70th birthday.

SECTION 5. Special police officers appointed under this act shall be subject to the rules and regulations, policies and procedures and requirements as the police commissioner may impose from time to time including, but not limited to, restrictions on the type and number of detail assignments, requirements regarding medical examinations to determine continuing fitness and capability to perform the duties of a special police officer, requirements for training, requirements for firearms licensing and qualifications, requirements for maintaining of a medical or liability insurance policy, and requirements regarding uniforms and equipment. The police commissioner shall, at the police commissioner's discretion, set a schedule of fees associated with the costs of

44	considered necessary by the police commissioner that shall be paid by the special police
45	officer appointed under this act. Special police officers appointed under this act shall
46	not be subject to section 96B of chapter 41 of the General Laws.
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48	SECTION 6. Special police officers appointed under this act shall be sworn in by
49	the police commissioner for the city of Cambridge.
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51	SECTION 7. Sections 100 and 111F of chapter 41 of the General Laws shall not
52	apply to special police officers appointed under this act. Sections 85H and $85H\frac{1}{2}$ of
53	chapter 32 of the General Laws shall not apply to special police officers appointed under
54	this act.
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56	SECTION 8. Appointment as a special police officer shall not entitle the appointee
57	to assignment to any detail.
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59	SECTION 9. Retired Cambridge police officers serving as special police officers
60	under this act shall be subject to the limitations on hours worked and on earnings

61	restrictions as provided in paragraph (b) of section 91 of chapter 32 of the General
62	Laws.
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64	SECTION 10. The City Manager as the appointing authority for the City will have
65	final say in all appointments and removals of special police officers under this act.
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67	SECTION 11 This act shall take effect upon its passage
