### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to refusal of complicity.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 94G of the General Laws is amended by adding thereto a new section 22, as
- 2 follows:
- 3 Section 22. Refusal of complicity
- 4 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, no law enforcement officer,
- official, employee, or other agent of the commonwealth or any city or town or other political
- 6 subdivision shall cause to be expended from public resources any assets, including time, money
- 7 or property, tangible or intangible, in the rendering of assistance to any law enforcement official
- 8 or other agent of the federal government in connection with the investigation or prosecution,
- 9 under federal law, of any individual for engaging in any activity in compliance with this chapter
- or chapter 94I, except as may be lawfully ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction.
