By Mr. Mirra of West Newbury, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4224) of Leonard Mirra and Kathleen O'Connor Ives (by vote of the town) that the town of Merrimac be authorized to appoint special police officers in said town. Public Service. [Local Approval Received.]

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Fourteen

An Act authorizing the appointment of special police officers in the town of Merrimac.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. The board of selectmen of the town of Merrimac may, upon
recommendation of the chief of police of said town and as the board deems necessary, appoint
retired Merrimac police officers as special police officers for the purpose of performing police
details or any police duties arising therefrom or during the course of police detail work, whether
or not related to such detail work. A special police officer appointed pursuant to this act must
have been a regular Merrimac police officer retired based on superannuation. Such special police
officer shall not be subject to the maximum age restrictions applied to regular police officers
pursuant to chapter 32 of the General Laws; provided, however, that no special police officer
shall be eligible to serve as such beyond the age of 70. A special police officer appointed
pursuant to this act must pass a medical examination by a physician or other certified

performing police details.
 SECTION 2. A special police officer appointed pursuant to this act shall not be subject to

professional chosen by the town to determine that he is capable of performing the essential duties of a special police officer, the cost of which shall be borne by the special police officer prior to

chapter 31, section 99A of chapter 41 or chapter 150E of the General Laws.

SECTION 3. A special police officer appointed pursuant to this act shall, when

performing duties pursuant to section 1, have the same power to make arrests and perform other functions as does a regular police officer in the town of Merrimac.

SECTION 4. A special police officer appointed pursuant to this act shall be appointed for an indefinite term, subject to removal by the board of selectmen of the town of Merrimac at any time, with or without cause, with 14 days' written notice. A special police officer appointed pursuant to this act shall not have any entitlement to continued appointment as such special police officer.

SECTION 5. A special police officer appointed pursuant to this act shall be subject to the rules, regulations, policies, procedures and requirements of the police department, chief of police and, as applicable, board of selectmen of the town of Merrimac, including restrictions on the type of detail assignment, requirements regarding medical examinations to determine continued capacity to perform the duties of a special police officer, requirements for training, requirements for firearm licensing and qualifications and requirements regarding uniforms and equipment. The cost of all training, uniforms and equipment shall be borne by the special police officer. A special police officer appointed pursuant to this section shall not be subject to section 96B of chapter 41 of the General Laws.

33 SECTION 6. A special police officer appointed pursuant to this act shall be sworn in 34 before the town clerk of the town of Merrimac, who shall keep a record of all such appointments.

35 SECTION 7. A special police officer appointed pursuant to this act shall be subject to 36 sections 100 and 111F of chapter 41 of the General Laws. The amount payable pursuant to said section 111F shall be calculated by averaging the amount earned over the prior 52 weeks as a 37 special police officer working police details, or averaged over such lesser period of time for any 39 officer designated as a special police officer less than 52 weeks before the incapacity. In no 40 event shall payment pursuant to said section 115F exceed, in any calendar year, the limitation on earning contained in subsection (b) of section 91 of chapter 32 of the General Laws. The 41 42 payment of benefits pursuant to said section 111F shall not terminate when a special police 43 officer reaches the age of 65; provided, however, that in no event shall the payment of such benefits extend to any special police officer beyond the age of 70. A special police officer appointed pursuant to this act shall not be subject to sections 85H or 89E of said chapter 32 or 45 eligible for any benefits pursuant to said sections. 46

SECTION 8. A special police officer appointed pursuant to this act shall be eligible for, but not entitled to, assignment to any detail by the chief of police of the town of Merrimac.

SECTION 9. A retired Merrimac police officer serving as a special police officer pursuant to this act shall be subject to the limitation on hours worked and on payments to retired town employees pursuant to subsection (b) of section 91 of chapter 32 of the General Laws.

SECTION 10. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

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
