An Act to keep college graduates working.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 13 of Chapter 30A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out lines 42 to 81, inclusive.

3 SECTION 2. Section 61 of Chapter 112 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
4 amended by striking out lines 82 to 123, inclusive.
