By Representative McKenna of Webster and Senator Fattman, a joint petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4270) of Joseph D. McKenna and Ryan C. Fattman (by vote of the town) that the town of Webster be authorized to grant an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises in said town. Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure. [Local Approval Received.]

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act authorizing the town of Webster to grant an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the general laws or any other 2 general or special law to the contrary, the licensing authority of the Town of Webster may grant 3 a license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises under section 12 of 4 said chapter 138 to The Rose Room, at 4 East Main Street in Webster, Massachusetts. The 5 license shall be subject to all of said chapter 138, except said section 17. The licensing authority 6 shall not approve the transfer of the license to any other person, organization or location but it 7 may grant the license to a new applicant at the same location if the applicant files a letter from 8 the department of revenue indicating that the license is in good standing with the department and 9 all applicable taxes have been paid. Upon the issuance of the license authorized in this act, The 10 Rose Room, shall return to the licensing authority the license it currently holds for BYOB (Beer 11 and Wine) to be drunk on the premises.

If the license granted under this act is cancelled, revoked, or no longer in use it shall be returned physically with all of the legal rights, privileges, and restrictions pertaining thereto to the licensing authority and the licensing authority may then grant the license to a new applicant at the same location under the same terms and conditions as specified in this act.
