An Act concerning disposable menstrual products in schools.

at the end thereof the following section 68A:--

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 2. For purposes of this section, "disposable menstrual products" means products

- Section 1. Chapter 71 of the Massachusetts General Laws is hereby amended by adding
- 4 including, but not limited to, tampons and sanitary napkins for use in connection with the
- 5 menstrual cycle.

- 6 Section 3. All elementary and secondary public schools in the Commonwealth serving
- 7 students in any grade from grade six through grade twelve shall provide disposable menstrual
- 8 products in the restrooms of such school building or buildings. Such products shall be provided
- 9 at no charge to students. Such amount may be adjusted from time to time based on utilization.
- 10 School districts shall work to ensure that such products shall be available in a convenient manner
- that does not stigmatize any student seeking such product.
- Section 4. This act shall take effect on August 1, 2020.
