Fallon and others (with the approval of the mayor and city council) relative to amending the administrative organization of financial officers in the city of Malden. ## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Twelve

An Act Amending the Administrative Organization of Financial Officers in the City of Malden.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 446 of the acts 1950, as appearing in section 3 of chapter 200
- 2 of the acts of 2011, is hereby amended by striking out the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth
- 3 sentences and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:- The treasurer shall have all the
- 4 powers and duties imposed by law and ordinance on municipal treasurers and collectors of taxes.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 2 of chapter 200 of the acts of 2011 is hereby repealed.
- 6 SECTION 3. The city council of Malden may from time to time, as it deems necessary and
- 7 appropriate, appoint by majority vote, a chief financial officer, who shall serve for the 3 years
- 8 next ensuing. The treasurer, the controller of accounts or a member of the board of assessors
- 9 may, at the city council's discretion, simultaneously hold the office of chief financial officer. The
- 10 compensation of the chief financial officer shall be fixed by ordinance, which shall specify the

11 salary for the position of chief financial officer alone, and for the position of chief financial  
12 officer held in combination with the office of treasurer, controller or accounts or assessor. The  
13 chief financial officer shall administer, coordinate and supervise all financial services, activities  
14 and officers, and assist in all matters relating to municipal financial affairs. He shall, under the  
15 direction of the mayor, prepare the annual appropriation order for consideration by the city  
16 council and, under the direction of the mayor and city council, develop and implement a long  
17 range capital plan. He shall make recommendations to the mayor and city council for enhancing  
18 revenue and revenue collections and shall perform such other duties as prescribed by the mayor  
19 and city council.

20 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
