**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act amending the charter of the Town of Nantucket concerning newspaper publication of town meeting warrants.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 2.5(b) of the charter of the town of Nantucket, adopted under the
2 provisions of chapter 289 of the acts of 1986, and as amended, on file with the archivist of the
3 commonwealth in accordance with section 12 of chapter 43B of the general laws, is hereby
4 amended by deleting the first sentence of said section 2.5(b) and inserting in place thereof the
5 following:- The Board of Selectmen shall publish notice of the issuance of the warrant of
6 each Town Meeting in a newspaper of general circulation within the Town promptly after such
7 issuance of the warrant.

8 Section 2. Said section 2.5 of the charter of the town of Nantucket is hereby further
9 amended by deleting in the second sentence the following words:- of the warrant.

10 Section 3. This act shall take effect upon passage.
