The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to acceptance of out-of-state identification in Massachusetts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 34B of Chapter 138 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official

2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the second paragraph the following paragraph:

3 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the commission shall permit a 4 licensee or agent or employee thereof to rely upon a valid license to operate a motor vehicle 5 issued by another state for proof of a person's identity and age. Any licensee, or agent or 6 employee, thereof, under this chapter who relies on such out of state license shall not suffer any 7 modification, suspension, revocation or cancellation of a license nor shall he or she suffer any 8 criminal liability for delivering or selling alcohol or alcoholic beverages to a person under 21 9 years of age. Any licensee, or agent or employee thereof, under this chapter who relies upon such a valid license for proof of a person's identity and age shall be presumed to have exercised due 10

- 11 care in making such delivery or sale of alcohol or alcoholic beverages to a person under 21 years
- 12 of age. Such presumption shall be rebuttable; provided, however, that nothing contained herein
- 13 shall affect the applicability of section 69.
