An Act authorizing the town of Weston to transfer certain recreation land known as Cat Rock.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the  
2 contrary, the town of Weston is hereby authorized to transfer and convey from the recreation  
3 commission a certain parcel of land, held for recreation purposes, located off Drabbington Way,  
4 being a parcel containing 64 acres, more or less (assessor’s map 14, lot 6) described in a deed  
5 dated October 8, 1957, recorded with the registry of deeds in book 9040, page 363, to the  
6 conservation commission, to be dedicated and held for conservation and passive and active  
7 recreational purposes, with certain portions of said parcel, comprising 32 acres, more or less, to  
8 be managed by the recreation commission, as the agent of the conservation commission, for  
9 active recreational activities, pursuant to a memorandum of agreement between the conservation  
10 commission and the recreation commission.

11           SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
