An Act relative to the use of headlights.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 15 of chapter 85 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the first sentence the following sentence:—

3 Every vehicle, whether stationary or in motion, on any public way, shall have attached to
4 it headlights and taillights which shall be turned on by the vehicle operator and so displayed as to
5 be visible from the front and rear during the period of one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour
6 before sunrise; provided, however, that such headlights and taillights shall be turned on by the
7 vehicle operator at all other times when, due to insufficient light or unfavorable atmospheric
8 conditions, visibility is reduced such that persons or vehicles on the roadway are not clearly
9 discernible at a distance of 500 feet, or the vehicle’s windshield wipers are needed; provided
10 further, that this section shall not apply to any vehicle which is designed to be propelled by hand;
11 and provided, further, that any vehicle carrying hay or straw for the purpose of transporting
12 persons on a hayride, so called, shall display only electrically operated lights which shall be 2
13 flashing amber lights to the front and 2 flashing red lights to the rear, each of said lights to be at
14 least 6 inches in diameter and mounted 6 feet from the ground.
