Rogers memorializing the Congress of the United States to secure the deletion of the word marihuana from the federal Controlled Substances Act; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3199) of Linda L. Noel for legislation to further regulate the cultivation of marijuana and marihuana; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3732) of Bradley H. Jones, Jr., Jason M. Lewis and James J. Dwyer (by vote of the town) that the town of Reading be authorized to prohibit marijuana establishments other than registered medical marijuana dispensaries, reports recommending the accompanying order (House, No. 4579) ought to be adopted.
