An Act relative to acceptance of out-of-state identification in Massachusetts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 34B of chapter 138 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018
2	Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the words "foreign country," in line 19, the
3	following:- a valid license to operate a motor vehicle issued by another state,
4	SECTION 2. Said section 34B of chapter 138, as so appearing, is hereby further amended
5	by striking out, in lines 25 through 27, inclusive, the words "a liquor purchase identification
6	card, or an identification card issued under section 8E of Chapter 90, or motor vehicle license
7	issued pursuant to said section eight", and inserting in place thereof the following:- identification
8	permitted by this section
