Ross (by vote of the town) that the town of Wayland be authorized to exempt all police personnel from the civil service law. Public Service. [Local Approval Received.]

### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act exempting all police personnel in the town of Wayland police department from the provisions of the civil service law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. All Police personnel in the Town of Wayland Police Department shall be
- 2 exempt from the provisions of Chapter 31 of the General Laws and related regulations applicable
- 3 thereto.
- 4 SECTION 2. The provisions of Section 1 of this act shall not impair the Civil Service
- 5 status of the present officers of the Town of Wayland Police Department except for the purpose
- 6 of promotion.
- 7 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
