An Act to establish a school choice circuit breaker.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1. Section 12B of Chapter 76 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (o) the following subsection:-
(p) Any sending district which experiences a net loss of more than $5 \%$ of its student population in a given grade or a net loss of more than $10 \%$ of its total student population from the prior year due to school choice, shall also be eligible to apply for a school choice reimbursement from the commonwealth as provided in subsection (n). The reimbursement amount shall be equal to 50 percent of the school choice tuition amount for each student enrolling in a receiving district in excess of $5 \%$ of the total population in a given grade during the prior year for the sending district or in excess of $10 \%$ of the total population during the prior year in the sending district.
