**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court  
(2019-2020)**

An Act providing for bleeding control training as part of the health education curriculum.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 71 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting, in line 26, after the words “shall not be  
3 offered.”, the following:—

4           Such instruction in health education shall also include bleeding control training. The  
5 department of education, in consultation with the department of public health, shall develop the  
6 bleeding control training required under this section using instructional materials developed or  
7 endorsed by the American College of Surgeons Committee on Trauma; the National Association  
8 of Emergency Medical Technicians; or the department of public health.
