The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to Chapter 30B: Uniform Procurement Act.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1: Method of Procurement. In the City of Boston, notwithstanding sections 4,
 5, 6 and 7 of M.G.L. ch. 30B, any other section of ch. 30B, or any other general or special law to
 the contrary, the City of Boston, the Boston Public Health Commission, the Boston Housing
 Authority, the Boston Water and Sewer Commission, and the Boston Redevelopment Authority
 may utilize the following:

(a) For the procurement of a supply or service in the amount of \$10,000 or greater, but
not more than the Small Purchase threshold as defined by the Massachusetts Operational
Services Division, a procurement officer may seek written quotations from not fewer than three
disadvantaged businesses, diverse businesses, or small and local business enterprises, as certified
by the Massachusetts Supplier Diversity Office or the City of Boston, customarily providing the
supply or service. The procurement officer shall record: (1) the names and addresses of all
persons from whom quotations were sought, (2) the specifications used for the procurement, (3)

13	the names of the persons submitting quotations and (4) the date and amount of each quotation.
14	Such information shall be retained in the file required pursuant to M.G.L. ch. 30B s. 3.
15	(b) The procurement officer shall award the contract to the eligible and responsible
16	bidder offering the needed quality of supply or service at the lowest quotation.
17	SECTION 2. Severance Clause. The provisions of this act are severable and if any
18	provision, or portion thereof, should be held to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by any
19	court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect the
20	remaining provisions, which remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3: Effective Date. This act shall take effect immediately upon signing by theGovernor.
