An Act relative to in law apartments

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 30 of chapter 184 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the first paragraph, the following
- 3 paragraph:-
- 4 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, no restriction determined to
- 5 be of such actual and substantial benefit may prevent a senior parent of a homeowner from
- 6 occupation of said addition or alteration as long as the following stipulations occur: (a) the
- 7 alteration or addition shall be one level not to exceed 1,000 square feet and may contain one
- 8 bedroom, living room, kitchen, dining area, and one full bathroom; (b) the unit may only be used
- 9 as senior housing and never as income property; provided, however, if the senior occupancy is

- 10 no longer needed, the unit shall be converted back to a common living area by the homeowner;
- 11 and (c)the unit must be altered subject to the building code of the commonwealth, and must
- 12 conform to Title V regulations in order to be granted a building permit.
