The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act regarding parental consent.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby revised as follows, with the addition of the

2 following sections:

3 Section 32B. Parental consent for out-of-school-district referrals, information, and

4 materials

No student in any public elementary or secondary school, without the prior written
consent of the parent or guardian, shall be referred to, or provided the contact information,
business card, brochure, or other informational materials of, an individual, organization, or entity
not employed by or under the direct control of the school district to which that student belongs ,
if such individual, organization, entity, or material involves information or counseling about
health, psychological problems, reproduction, abortion, sexual education, sexual orientation,
gender identity, bullying, or similar issues.

Section 32C. Parental consent for student surveys regarding personal or private issues

14	No student in any public elementary or secondary school, without the prior written
15	consent of the parent or guardian, shall be requested or required to submit to a survey, analysis,
16	or evaluation concerning personal issues including, but not limited to: (1) emotional and
17	psychological concerns or issues, whether concerning the student or his family (including mental
18	health screenings); (2) sexual behavior and attitudes; (3) illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or
19	demeaning behaviors; (4) feelings of victimization; (5) suicide attempts or ideation, or self-
20	abuse; (6) birth control or abortion; (7) critical appraisals of other individuals with whom
21	respondent has family relationships; (8) legally recognized privileged or analogous relationships,
22	such as those with lawyers, physicians, therapists, and ministers; (9) political affiliations; or (10)
23	income. This will apply to all such surveys whether from a state or federal agency, whether
24	administered in a classroom setting, by a school counselor, a school nurse, or school based health
25	center staff member. All such screenings, surveys, analyses, and evaluations shall be made
26	reasonably available with adequate advance notice to parents, guardians, educators, school
27	administrators, and others for inspection and review prior to being administered.
