#### AN ACT ESTABLISHING A CAP ON CANDIDATES' COMMITTEES CAMPAIGN FUNDS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 55 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the definition of "Political party committee" the
- 3 following definition:-
- 4 "Surplus funds", any funds remaining in the depository account of a candidate's committee in
- 5 excess of \$30,000 for a candidate for state representative and \$100,000 for a candidate for state
- 6 senate.
- 7 SECTION 2: Section 19 of chapter 55 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official
- 8 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (f) the following subsection:-
- 9 (g) Within 60 days after the conclusion of an election, the candidate's committee shall be
- required to dispose of surplus funds: (1) in accordance with campaign finance laws as established
- in chapter 55; (2) by returning the remaining funds proportionally to all donors; or (3) through
- donation to a charitable organization.
