In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act to close certain campaign finance loopholes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1: Chapter 55, Section 6 is amended in the third paragraph by inserting after
- 2 the third sentence the following-
- The political committee of a political party may contribute to the campaign fund of a
- 4 candidate; provided, however, that the aggregate of all contributions for the benefit of any one
- 5 candidate and the non-elected political committee organized on such candidate's behalf shall not
- 6 exceed in any one calendar year the sum of three thousand dollars in the case of each town or
- 7 ward committee.
- 8 SECTION 2: Chapter 55, Section 7A(a) (2) by inserting at the end the following
- 9 sentence:

"An individual may in addition make campaign contributions for the benefit of elected 10 political committees or non-elected political committees organized on behalf of a political party; 11 provided, however, that the total contribution in any one calendar year shall not exceed the sum 12 of five hundred dollars in the case of town or ward committees representing a jurisdiction outside 13 the jurisdiction in which the individual keeps their principle residence."
