## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act establishing a prescription drug rebate program for seniors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any laws to the contrary, all residents of the
- 2 Commonwealth over the age of 65 with an adjusted gross household income of \$50,000 annually
- 3 or less, are eligible for a prescription drug rebate.
- 4 SECTION 2. All prescription drugs, as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 94C of the
- 5 General Laws, are eligible for the rebate program.
- 6 SECTION 3. Rebate shall be defined as a reimbursement for the total out of pocket
- 7 expenses, including insurance co-pays, incurred by an eligible individual for prescription drugs.
- 8 Rebates shall be disbursed to eligible individuals from the General Fund.
- 9 SECTION 4. The Commissioner shall prescribe the process by which an eligible
- individual shall file for a rebate.
- SECTION 5. Rebates shall not exceed \$2,500 per individual annually

- SECTION 6. The Commissioner shall report on the impact of this rebate program to the
  Committees of Ways & Means and the Joint Committee on Health Care Financing on an annual
  basis, commencing one year from the date the program goes into effect.
- SECTION 7. This rebate program shall expire four years from the date of effect unless reauthorized by the legislature.
