An Act requiring legible pharmaceutical orders and prescriptions. $\hfill\square$.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter 94C of the General Laws, or any

2 other general or special law to the contrary, no pharmacist, retail drug store or dispenser may fill

- 3 any prescription or pharmaceutical order unless said prescription or pharmaceutical order has
- 4 been hand printed, typed or electronically generated.

5 Section 2. Any violation of the above provision shall result in a fine of not more than \$1000 per

6 incident and possible revocation of license to dispense.
