By Mr. Beaton of Shrewsbury, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 659) of Matthew A. Beaton and Kimberly N. Ferguson for legislation to to implement a striped bass commercial tagging program at the point of harvest. Environment, Natural Resources and Agriculture.

An Act protecting the legal harvest of striped bass.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Whereas the illegal harvesting of striped bass has the potential to undermine the
2	sustainability of striped bass populations on the Atlantic Coast; and
3	
4	☐ Whereas the illegal harvest of striped bass has the potential to reduce the economic
5	opportunities of commercial fisherman who are legally participating in the fishery; and
6	
7	□ Whereas at the February 2012 Atlantic States Marine Fishery Commission (ASMFC) Striped
8	Bass Management Board meeting a motion was passed to initiate the development of an
9	addendum to incorporate the recommendations made by the Interstate Watershed Task Force
10	(IWTF) and the ASMFC Law Enforcement Committee (LEC) on reducing the illegal harvest of
11	striped bass; and
12	
13	□Whereas the IWTF and LEC recommended that all Atlantic States and jurisdictions implement
14	a uniform commercial tagging system where striped bass are harvested and landed for sale; and
15	
16	☐ Whereas the IWTF and LEC recommended that all fish harvested for sale be tagged
17	immediately upon possession at the point of harvest; and
18	
19	☐ Whereas the IWTF and LEC recommended that the States and jurisdictions issue a set of
20	number tags based on a sound scientific sample of the average (mean) weight of legal-sized fish
21	harvested in open season for that type of gear divided into the weight quota; and

23	□ Whereas the IWTF and LEC recommended requiring all unused tags to be returned on annual
24	or seasonal basis and prohibit license renewal if unused tags are not returned; and
25	
26	☐ Whereas the IWTF and LEC recommended the implementation of license revocation or
27	suspension as a primary penalty for state or federal violations;; and
28	
29	☐ Whereas the IWTF and LEC recommended that states and jurisdictions' law enforcement
30	officers have real-time access to tag numbers issued to each fisherman; and
31	
32	☐ Whereas at the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission 2012 Summer Meeting a motion
33	was made to approve the IWTF and LEC recommendations for a uniform commercial tagging
34	program at the point of harvest; and
35	
36	☐ Whereas a motion was made by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to substitute for this
37	option to tag at the point of harvest; and
38	
39	☐ Whereas this motion was practically for no action to be taken now and for the states to act at
40	their own discretion at a later date; and

42	□Whereas that motion passed by an 8 in favor, 7 opposed and 1 abstention and thus a motion for
43	no action was accepted;

45	☐ Therefore be it resolved that the Massachusetts Marine Fisheries Commission working with the
46	Massachusetts Director of Marine Fisheries adopt the recommendations made by the Interstate
47	Watershed Task Force and the Atlantic State Marine Fisheries Commission Law Enforcement
48	Committee to implement a striped bass commercial tagging program at the point of harvest.
