An Act relative to prevention of hazardous material release.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 21E of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting, after  
2 section 7, the following section:-

3 Section 7A. Notwithstanding any general or special law or rule or regulation to the  
4 contrary, the department of environmental protection shall, upon receipt of permission to enter  
5 upon or access commercial or non-residential property by the owner of said property or by the  
6 municipality if the owner refuses, perform containment actions as defined by section 2 of this  
7 chapter, and recover costs of same from the owner or operator of said property or the Federal  
8 Leaking Underground Storage Tank Program, as determined to be reasonable and proper by the  
9 department.
