The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act encouraging academic success.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 There is hereby established a special commission to study the optimal start and end times 2 for school days at public elementary and secondary schools in the commonwealth. The 3 commission shall consist of 5 members: the commissioner of elementary and secondary 4 education, who shall serve as the chair; 1 member of the house of representatives, to be 5 appointed by the speaker of the house; 1 member of the senate, to be appointed by the president 6 of the senate; and 2 members to be appointed by the governor. The commission shall study the 7 mental and physical effects of a later start time for school days on students, and the social, 8 economic and safety concerns of such a later start time. The commission may conduct public 9 hearings, forums or meetings to gather information. The commission shall report its findings to

- 10 the governor and the clerks of the house of representatives and the senate, together with any
- recommendations for legislation, within 2 years of the effective date of this act.
