Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 3 SECTION 1. Section 28 of Chapter 118G of the Massachusetts General Laws is hereby
- 4 amended by deleting the existing definition of a Personal Care Attendant (PCA) and by replacing
- 5 said existing definition with the following new definition:
- 6 Personal Care Attendant (PCA) a person, including a personal aide, who has been selected by a
- 7 consumer or the consumer's surrogate to provide personal care services to persons with
- 8 disabilities or seniors under the MassHealth personal care attendant program or any successor
- 9 program, or under any program operated by an entity under contract in whole or in part with
- 10 MassHealth, the Executive Office of Health & Human Services and/or the Executive Office of
- 11 Health & Human Services departments and divisions.

- 12 SECTION 2. Section 31(b) of Chapter 118G of the Massachusetts General Laws is hereby
- amended by adding the following phrase at the end of the fifth sentence in that subsection:
- 14 ",or under any program operated by an entity under contract in whole or in part with MassHealth,
- 15 the Executive Office of Health & Human Services and/or the Executive Office of Health &
- 16 Human Services departments and divisions."
- 17 SECTION 3. MassHealth and/or the Executive Office of Health and Human Services and its
- 18 departments and divisions, shall promulgate such rules and regulations as are necessary for the
- 19 implementation and administration of this section.
