## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- There shall be added to Massachusetts General Law chapter 62, Section 6(k)(9), the
- 2 following:-
- 3 (10) Upon request, in writing, by a taxpayer who is 65 years of age or older, a city or town
- 4 shall furnish the taxpayer a written record of the taxpayer's "real estate tax payment" as defined
- 5 in this section (k) for up to three prior calendar years free of charge to the requesting taxpayer,
- 6 but no city or town shall be required to furnish a written record without charge for any given
- 7 calendar year for which a written record has been previously provided except that a city or town

8	shall provide duplicate written records for a reasonable charge in accordance with regulations
9	promulgated by the Commissioner of Revenue.
