The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act requiring mental health parity for disability policies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 108 of chapter 175 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
 adding the following:-

"13. No individual policy of short-term or long-term disability insurance providing
income replacement benefits that is issued or renewed in the Commonwealth shall impose
benefit limitations or exclusions upon claimants affected by behavioral health disorders, where
such limitations or exclusions are not imposed equally upon claimants affected by physical
disorders "

8 SECTION 2. Section 110 of chapter 175 of the General Laws is hereby amended by 9 adding the following subsection:-

10 "(Q) No certificate of coverage under a group policy of short-term or long-term disability 11 insurance providing income replacement benefits that is issued or renewed in the Commonwealth 12 shall impose benefit limitations or exclusions upon claimants affected by behavioral health 13 disorders, where such limitations or exclusions are not imposed equally upon claimants affected 14 by physical disorders." 15 SECTION 3. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prohibit periodic medical exams

16 or other procedures reasonably calculated to determine whether or not a disability exists, or

17 continues to exist; provided said examinations, procedures or protocols are comparable and no

18 more frequent or onerous that those required for disabilities caused by physical disorders.
