In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to the recidivism reducing program reporting by the Commissioner of the Department of Correction.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 124 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
2	Official Edition, is hereby amended, in line 41, by inserting after the word "department;" the
3	following words:- and annually report on the outcomes on recidivism of programs of
4	rehabilitation of inmates upon discharge from the department of correction identified in
5	paragraph (e). The report must identify a program group and a proper control group, and report
6	on the rate of recidivism for each group, and report if there is or is not a statistically significant
7	difference between the two groups.
