An Act relative to ensuring public entities are not injured by long term contracts \Box .

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 12 of chapter 30B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the first paragraph and replacing it with the following
- 3 new paragraph:-
- 4 "(a) Unless otherwise provided by law and subject to paragraph (b), a governmental body may
- 5 not enter into a contract for a period of time exceeding five consecutive years, including
- 6 renewals. The procurement officer shall not enter into a contract unless funds are available for
- 7 the first fiscal year at the time of contracting. Payment and performance obligations for
- 8 succeeding fiscal years shall depend on the availability and appropriation of funds. If an

- 9 awarding authority determines it is in its best interests to have a contract for a period of longer
- 10 than five years, including renewals, the awarding authority shall seek the written approval of the
- 11 state auditor before the issuance of any such request for proposals.
