An Act relative to electric poles..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 34B of Chapter 164 of the General Laws as appearing in the 2008 Official
- 2 Edition is hereby amended by adding after the word ‘pole;’ in line 5 the following:—
- 3 “Provided further, that a city or town may enforce this section by the enactment of a local
- 4 ordinance or by law prohibiting double poles beyond the ninety days authorized by this section,
- 5 violation of which may be punishable by a fine not to exceed a maximum of two thousand five
- 6 hundred dollars per occurrence.”
