Crighton (by vote of the town) relative to exempting all positions in the police department and fire department of the town of Swampscott from the civil service law. Public Service. **The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court  
(2021-2022)**

An Act exempting all positions in the police department and fire department of the town of Swampscott from the civil service law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, all positions in  
2 the police department and the fire department of the town of Swampscott shall be exempt from  
3 chapter 31 of the General Laws.

4 SECTION 2. This act shall not impair the civil service status of a person holding a  
5 position described in section 1 on the effective date of this act.

6 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 2, no appointments or  
7 promotions made after the effective date of this act will be governed in any way by chapter 31 of  
8 the General Laws.

9 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.
