3 Section 32O. (a) A person who, while in the course of trafficking or unlawfully

4 distributing a controlled substance as defined in section 32E, knowingly or intentionally

- 5 manufactures, distributes, dispenses, delivers, gives away, barters, administers or provides any
- 6 amount of a controlled substance or counterfeit substance which results in death shall be
- 7 punished as murder in the second degree as defined by section 1 of chapter 265.
- 8 (b) Lack of knowledge of a previous health condition shall not be a defense to a violation9 of this section.
