## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act providing opportunities for apprentices to complete their training and ensuring for a skilled workforce in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 26 of Chapter 149 is hereby amended by adding at the end:
- 2 For projects over one million dollars, the total hours of employees, by trade, receiving an
- 3 hourly wage who are directly employed on the site of the project, employed by the contractor or
- 4 a subcontractor and subject to the prevailing wage, shall be performed by apprentices in bona
- 5 fide apprentice training programs as provided in sections 11H and 11I of chapter 23 of the
- 6 General Laws which are approved by the division of apprentice training in the executive office
- 7 of labor and workforce development and in compliance with apprentice ratios established by any
- 8 trades license board.
- 9 Six months after the passage of this act 5% of the hours shall be performed by
- 10 apprentices.
