## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to sex offender classification.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 178E of chapter 6 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (q) the following subsection:-
- 3 Subsection (r). The sex offender registry board shall prioritize the registration process of
- 4 sex offenders convicted of 1 or more offenses that have been designated a sexually violent
- 5 offense or sex offenses against a child, in accordance with the Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against
- 6 Children and Sexually Violent Offender Registration Act, 42 U.S.C. section 14071, requiring by
- 7 operation of law a minimum Level 1 life time registration for those convicted as adults and 20
- 8 year registration for those adjudicated as juveniles.
